### **Untouchable** [Olivier Nakache, Eric Toledano, 2011]

**Country: France: in French with subtitles**

Irreverent comedy based on a true story of the friendship between a disabled millionaire (Francois Cluzet) and his street-smart ex-con caretaker (Omar Sy). *BAFTA nominated for Best Foreign Language Film*

### **About Elly** [Asghar Farhadi, 2009]

**Country: Iran: in Persian with subtitles**

A group of middle-class friends travel from Tehran to spend the weekend at the seaside. When one of them goes missing, a frantic search begins and a web of deceit starts to unravel.

### **Amour** [Michael Haneke, 2012]

**Country: France: in French with subtitles**

The loving relationship of Georges (Jean-Louis Trintignant) and Anne (Emmanuelle Riva), both in their eighties, is tested when Anne suffers an attack that leaves her increasingly incapacitated.

**Country: Lebanon: In Arabic with subtitles**

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### **The Forgiveness of Blood** [Joshua Marston, 2011]

**Country: Albania: in Albanian with subtitles**

An Albanian family is torn apart by a murder. The resulting blood feud forces son Nik (Tristan Halilaj) into hiding as he becomes the prime target for vengeance while his sister, Rudina (Sindi Lacey), has to leave school to take over the family business.

### **No** [Pablo Larraín, 2012]

**Country: Chile: in Spanish with subtitles**

Chile, 1988: When dictator Augusto Pinochet calls a plebiscite on the future of his presidency, the result seems certain. However, leaders of the ‘No’ campaign recruit a brash young advertising executive (Gael García Bernal) with an audacious plan to win against all the odds. *Oscar nominated for Best Foreign Language Film*

### **5 Broken Cameras** [Emad Burnat, Guy Davidi, 2011]

**Country: Palestine: in Hebrew & Arabic with subtitles**

Documentary chronicling a Palestinian village’s resistance to the actions of the Israeli army told through images captured on 5 cameras owned by a local farmer. Eventually, each camera is broken, but they all tell their own story.
